A.O.B	BBA funds are increasing and it is important that funds are seen to be used for the benefit of beekeepers and beekeeping in the Borders. As most of the surplus funds come from the Beginners courses, a suggestion of using some of the funds for subsidising the Basic Beekeepers Certificate exam fee for a number of members per year. This would continue the priority of education and training. This will be added to the full November committee meeting for discussion (30 th November)
